Celia has been diagnosed with vascular malformations in her intestinal track as well as a mild blood clotting disorder. As a result, she has a lot of internal bleeding. She has required blood transfusions and blood clotting treatments to stabilize her for the majority of her life.

That being said, it is important to watch Celia. If she becomes lethargic, pale or you see a sudden change in her demeanor (like laying her head down on her desk) – call me immediately at (502) 000-0000. If I cannot be reached, call an ambulance and have her taken to Norton Children's Hospital.

Her medical folder that is kept at the front office, contains her medical history as well as her insurance card and permission to treat in case she needs to be taken to Norton Children's Hospital. This needs to accompany her to the hospital should the need arise.

She also requires frequent hospital treatments and visits to her specialists. She will be absent more than most children due to this fact. She is very studious, but there may be times that her make up work is turned in later than expected due to low blood levels or procedures/surgeries she needs. I will do my best to keep you informed of her, but please be patient with us as we are very distracted at times when our total focus is on her care.
